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
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Automagic flow of data





The Problem

- No national digital design for community services delivered by integrated teams across health and social care.
- No agreement on what data should be captured by community services whilst providing care.
- No national mandated data standards in community services.
- Limited sharing of data for community services across health and social care.
- Data gaps at regional and national level around community services.
- Limited analytical capacity locally nationally to develop the required data insights.

The Challenges

- No mechanism to mandate national digital design and data standards in social care.
- Limited resource currently available at a national and local level to take this programme of work forward.
- No social care data board in place, to oversee and prioritise national digital designs and associated data standards.
- No senior lead identified from the social care sector to take this work forward.
- Regional partnership boards, who are key stakeholders, at varying levels of maturity not engaged with developing data insights.



The Solution

- A programme to develop national digital design, data standards and insights for community services to underpin the clinical\care process.
- Enabling information to be shared safely and appropriately across health and social care systems to deliver seamless care.
- Using this information to populate national databases for those services in scope to be hosted by Digital Health and Care Wales (DHCW).
- Regional and national data insights around community services developed using the data held on the national databases, addressing current data gaps.

Services in Scope





Six Step Approach

DHCW facilitated national practitioner workshops to develop a National digital design and data standards Regional reviews to discuss proposed national digital design and data standards DHCW facilitated follow up national practitioner workshop to discuss outcome of regional reviews

Initial sign off of national digital design and data standards

Build, test, pilot and evaluate. Where applicable this will be in the Welsh Community Care Information System Final sign off of national digital design and data standards, though agreed governance to mandate national implementation



Benefits of the Approach

- Open to all community services providers regardless of system used.
- Multi disciplinary approach Practitioners, Business Analysts, Data Standards Developers and Information Analysts involved at the beginning.
- Design with data ensuring it is entered once but used many times.
- DHCW uniquely placed to provide the required skills and infrastructure to deliver associated economies of scale this approach brings.
- Nationally funded with no charge to Local Authorities and Health Boards
- Strategic fit to deliver Healthier Wales information requirements in partnership with the National Data Resource programme.
- Addresses the limited analytical capacity currently available in Social Care, through DHCW providing data directly to Welsh Government.
